Examination duration:

- The duration of each examination is indicated in the timetable above.
- Duration of the paper is **working time** only.
- All written examinations start with 5 minutes reading time (unless indicated otherwise).

Venue:

- Written examinations will be held in **Rooms 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18.**

Language examinations:

- Language speaking and listening components of the examinations will be **arranged by the language teachers**. Listening will take place in the week prior to examinations. Teachers will arrange speaking times with individual students.

Music practical examinations:

- Music practical examinations will be **arranged by the music teachers**.

Student Instructions:

- Timetabled lessons **will not** occur during the Preliminary Examination period for Year 11 students. Students are only required to be on the school site for their scheduled examinations. If day students are on site on a day when they do not have a scheduled examination they **must** sign in at Student Attendance.
- Students are to **wear full school** uniform to **all** examinations.
- Students are to arrive **15 minutes before** each examination is to begin, and are to assemble in the **Top Quad**. The starting times are indicated on the timetable. No allowance will be made for students who have misread the timetable.
- The duration of each examination is indicated on the timetable.
- Students may enter the examination **up to 30 minutes after** the official starting time.
- **Reading time** is for reading, and **NO writing or highlighting** may be undertaken during reading time. The supervising teacher will advise students when they may take up their pens.
- Students may **not leave** the examination before the conclusion of the examination.
- Students may not leave the examination room during an examination unless accompanied by a Supervisor.
- Any equipment brought into the examination room will be subject to inspection before the examination commences.
- It is the **responsibility of the student** to supply equipment that is in good working order. This includes calculators.
- Students must have writing equipment (pens, pencils, rulers, erasers, sharpener, stapler, protractors, etc.) in a **clear** case. Students are **not** permitted to borrow equipment during an examination.
- Students may use black or blue pens only. Liquid paper is not permitted. Highlighter may only be used on question booklets, not in answers.
- All calculators must be approved by NESAs.
- Students must **remove watches** and **wrist bands** and place them in clear view on their examination table. **Smart watches are not permitted.**
- **No liquid paper, food, drink, mobile phones or electronic communication devices** are permitted in the examination. Keep them in your lockers. You may bring **water in a clear bottle.**
- Supervisors will not be responsible for the safekeeping of any unauthorized material.
- If a student is **absent from an examination** due to illness/misadventure she **must:**
 1. notify the school **before 8:00 am** and leave her name, examination subject and phone number with the Learning Office **and;**
 2. provide a medical certificate and/or written documentation to the Learning Office.
- Arrangements will be made, **as soon as possible**, for absent students to complete make up examinations within this examination period. A student's results in these make up examinations may be used as a guide to **estimate** a final examination mark.
- Students must tell the invigilator if they feel unwell before or during an examination.
- Illness/misadventure provisions **do not cover** misreading timetables, misreading of examinations, equipment failure or any events which could have been avoided by the student.
